MARCH BREAK WEEK at LKTYP

Lorraine Kimsa Theatre for Young People (LKTYP) is thrilled to welcome Montreal's **Théâtre Tout à Trac** and their clever adaptation of **Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland***. This beautiful take on the beloved children's classic will be presented on the Mainstage from March 1 to 19, 2011, with added performances during March Break.

Alice is once again day dreaming rather than doing homework when a book-devouring rabbit appears out of nowhere. Alice chases him down his rabbit hole and suddenly finds herself in Wonderland – a nonsensical universe populated by the Queen of Hearts, Humpty Dumpty, the Cheshire Cat, the Mad Hatter and a host of peculiar residents. Watch this award-winning adaptation of the classic story as the set and props morph from simple objects into something magical and puppetry and mask are ingeniously integrated into the action. It's Lewis Carroll's masterpiece like you've never seen it before!

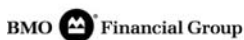
